Class structures

Our school is still growing. We are still able to offer smaller than average class sizes right across the school. This allows for maximal learning opportunities for our students.

Teachers and ES staff create flexible learning groups using student data to ensure all students get what they need. This allow teachers to extend students who are doing really well in a curriculum area and also provides flexibility to cater for those students who require longer to consolidate a concept...the best of both worlds.
