### Student classroom I.T. news

For the past few years our School Council has been discussing upgrading some of our classroom technology that is used by students as part of their everyday leaning.



Working with our Specialist Technician we sought quotes from recommended D.E. suppliers. We have purchased 20 x apple

iPads and 20 x Lenovo laptops for use in our classrooms.

These devices come with their own charging stations and other hardware. Our technicians will take a

few weeks to prepare these devices which will be available for all classes early in term 2. Pretty exciting.

# Federal Grant

We spent quite a deal of time and effort applying for Federal funding for a number of projects including upgrading our electrical supply, remove and replace external cladding & adding new aluminium windows. Unfortunately, we were not successful on this occasion. We will continue to seek funding for these projects as opportunities arise.

### Staff Professional Learning day - Friday May 17th

Our school is devoting time reviewing our classroom management strategies to ensure that all our teachers and staff use consistent, school-wide evidence-based processes and language for classroom management.

We will be reviewing our 'Respectful Classroom Behaviours' processes.

It is really important that students understand that the process is consistent and it doesn't matter what teacher they have or what class they are in - our expectations are always the same.

By doing this we ensure that there are no grey areas or inconsistencies when students are in lessons. Our Inclusion and Wellbeing team are leading this process.

We will have an initial staff PL after school on Tuesday April 23<sup>rd</sup> with Fiona Berry our Child Psychologist. This will be followed by a whole school Professional Learning Day on Friday May 17<sup>th</sup>.

We have already gathered numerous evidence-based processes and the philosophies behind them for consideration. All these align with our school values. By revisiting our 'Respectful Classroom Behaviours' processes all students and staff will know exactly what the expectations are. We will post updates in our newsletter.

# Anaphylaxis Policy 'NO NUTS or NUT PRODUCTS' to be brought to school

Our school has several students who have Anaphylaxis allergies. We are requesting families do not send foods that may contain peanuts/nuts etc. to school.

### Soft drinks at school

Did you know that one 355 ml can of Coca- Cola contains 39 grams of sugar (10 teaspoons).



A 2-litre bottle of coke or other fizzy drink contains about 218g of sugar. That is 44 teaspoons. or 66 cubes of sugar in the bottle.

Just a reminder to our families that soft drinks of any kind are not to be sent to school They are full of sugar and hype children up. Water or a fruit juice is the best option. If your child brings a fizzy drink to school, it will be taken and they can take it home with them at the end of the day.

Also please try to include some fruit and a sandwich for your child. It is not OK to have packets of chips, biscuits, lollies etc. for recess and lunch breaks.

Student Advisory update from Hadia, Jade, Issac and Luke



WE have partnered with Merri-bek Council to trial the 'TAG ON' strategy (Inspiring Active Travel To School). Every child will receive their own 'Tag On' fob and can register at the 'Tag On' Kiosk when they arrive at school

before the bell (The Kiosk is located at the end of the main corridor near the 5/6 classes).

The fob registers reach student's name, house team, and how they got to school... walk/ride/skate/rollerblade/car/bus etc. You get points for your house team for being more active. Teachers will check the points each child earns each week.

The team that scores the most 'active' points gets a special activity at the end of the term.
